Best Use of Visual Journalism and Storytelling Tools: Tagesspiegel Innovation Lab "Interactive database on the AfD"

Concept: Initial situation

The <u>Correctiv publications in 2024</u> about the secret meeting in Potsdam revealed the extent of hatred against migrants and minorities within the AfD. Millions were shocked, many of got out on the streets. However, the party's positions are not surprising, nor are they new. If you look at what AfD members of state parliaments have been saying publicly for years, it becomes clear that 'remigration' is just the tip of the iceberg.


Rather, the demand for mass deportation is the result of a continuous development. With an increasing number of members of state parliaments, the AfD has been continuously pushing the boundaries of what can be said in German parliaments for ten years. All of this can be shown by an exclusive data analysis of the speeches of all AfD MPs in German state parliaments since 2014.

Tagesspiegel Innovation Lab has analysed all of these parliamentary speeches in full, totalling 340,000 paragraphs and over 15 million words. With the help of language models, it was possible to recognise where and in what context xenophobic content is propagated in speeches, in some cases automatically.

Concept: Technical requirements

- Behind the interactive search is a long-term research project whose data the application accesses. StateParl (doi.org/10.7802/2744) has provided direct and automatable access to the minutes since August 2024.
 This makes analysing state parliament debates much easier than it was before.
- The data is regularly updated by a team at Freie Universität Berlin and the spokespersons are identified. For this purpose, PDF and Word files are read out, converted into plain text and stored in a database with metadata such as the speaker, the federal state and the parliamentary group. Based on this data, we first iteratively trained a language model using qualitative methods to identify xenophobic statements.

Concept: Technical requirements



- With the support of topic modelling and other analysis strategies, the most important narratives were analysed and representative quotes were selected.
- The article is based on the status of the first data publication on 15 July 2024.
